
Page 8. Material from later in the text that explores different instructions for the looping materials.


Extended Techniques

Headless Notes: Headless stems indicate non-sung vocalisations that follows the rough contours of the indicated shapes. These are unmeasured, but rhythmic stems indicate whether they are intended to be rapid, or slow. A written instruction will show whether the material is to be spoken, whispered, shouted etc.

In the below example the 'rr' is to be rolled strongly, and gliss. downwards.



Crossed Noteheads: Are used for percussion, written indications will specify the type. The two lines show the separate hands.



Algorithmic Textures: Several textures in this piece are based around repeating loops that are performed independently of the other ensemble members. Written instructions at the start of your loop will indicate when you are to move on and whether you begin as a section or individual. When a signal to move on arrives, always move straight on no matter where you are in your loop.


Enter together, independently at your own tempo. Repeat until the conductor signals Figure 2, move straight on wherever you are in this phrase.
